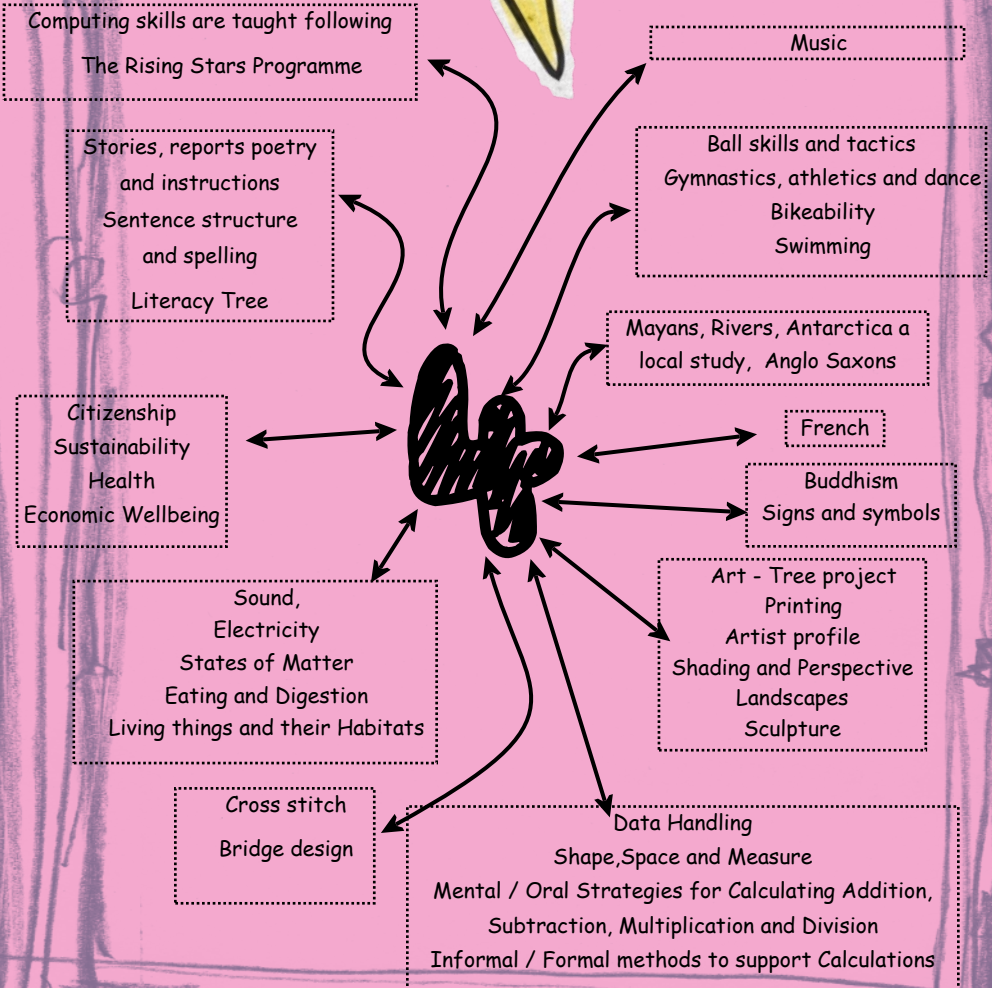
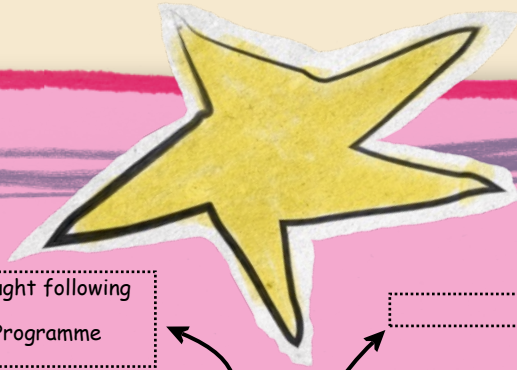

## P.E. Kit

Indoors: Black shorts, blue T-shirt, pumps. Outdoors: as above plus trainers and warm clothing (tracksuit) Make sure your child has named indoor shoes. PE is on Thursday but please make sure your child has a named P.E. kit in school EVERYDAY. No jewellery to be worn on P.E. Days. Swimming kit will be required on Fridays. Water - please could children have a water bottle to keep in class every day.

## Home Activities

Your child will be given a large home activities book. Activities are given to them every Thursday. It should take no longer than 30 minutes but if they are happy to spend more time on this, that's fine.

## Spellings and Times Tables

Spellings and Times tables are tested weekly and new ones are given. Children will be expected to sit a National times tables assessment in the Summer term. Y4 children are expected to have instant recall of times tables up to 12x12

## READING

The importance of this core skill cannot be over emphasised. Children will be asked to read in and out of school each week, from a range of different sources (school book, interest book, newspaper etc).

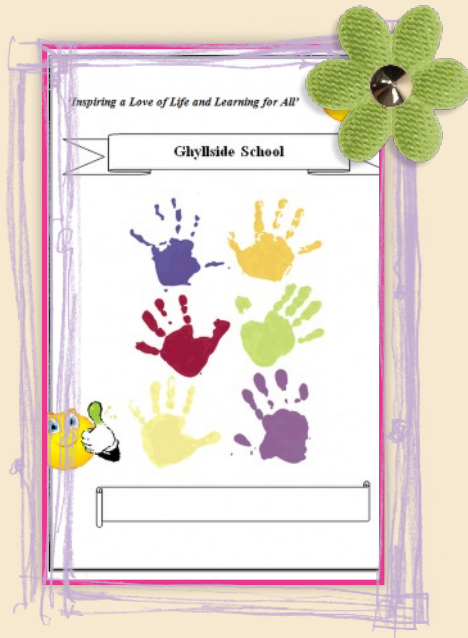
In school the children will read in silence for periods of time, be listened to by an adult and involved in Guided Reading group activities. Even at this age, when some children are competent readers, it is essential that parents take an interest in children's reading, model good reading habits and ask questions about the text in order to develop comprehension skills.



## Trips and Visits

In Autumn we will see a performance at Kendal Theatre. We visit the Buddhist Centre in Spring and in Summer we organise an Outdoor Activities Residential. A letter detailing all trips will be sent out in September. We do try to keep costs to a minimum, however we request a voluntary contribution of between £10 and £20 for each trip.
